

#### Diversity and Harmony: General

- Diverse populations
- Diverse communities
- Diverse health needs
  - high cancer risk (clusters)
  - avoidable cancers
  - screening and early detection
  - state-of-the-art treatment
  - access to care
  - research
- Harmony despite diversity

- Cooperation
- Collaboration
- Communication
- Consensus

### Harmony: The Four "C" (2)

- Cooperate
  - to act together in common effort
  - to work with others for mutual benefit
- Collaborate
  - to work jointly or labor together
  - to assist willingly
  - to cooperate with an agency with which one is not immediately connected

## Harmony: The Four "C" (3)

- Communicate
  - to *convey* knowledge of or information about from one to another by *clear signs*
  - to transmit or express ideas effectively
- Consensus
  - general agreement arrived at by most of those concerned
  - group solidarity in sentiment or belief


