### CEO Cancer Gold Standard™ FACT SHEET

The CEO Cancer Gold Standard is a workplace wellness accreditation program that encourages and recognizes organizations that take concrete actions to address cancer in their workplaces. The Gold Standard provides a framework for employers to have a healthier workforce by focusing on cancer risk reduction, early detection and high-quality care. All of the requirements of the Gold Standard are based on scientific evidence, and the program is reviewed annually to ensure that it remains comprehensive and up to date.



#### **PREVENTION**

Take these steps to help prevent cancer.

- Maintain a tobacco-free workplace and offer tobacco-cessation support
- Offer programs and services that focus on healthy nutrition, physical activity and healthy weight
- Cover appropriate vaccinations



#### **SCREENING**

Provide coverage for evidence-based cancer screening exams - to detect certain cancers at an early stage, when management or treatment has the best chance for a positive outcome.



#### **CANCER CLINICAL TRIALS**

Ensure access to participation in cancer clinical trials.



## QUALITY TREATMENT AND SURVIVORSHIP

Ensure access to quality cancer treatment and respond to the unique needs of employees who are cancer survivors or who are caring for a cancer survivor.



# HEALTH EDUCATION AND HEALTH PROMOTION

Educate and inform employees about cancer prevention, screening, clinical trials, quality care and survivorship; and promote employee engagement and participation in healthy workplace initiatives.



The Gold Standard's three main goals – risk reduction, early detection and quality care – focus on five critical areas known as the **Five Pillars**, which align with the Gold Standard's goals and requirements.
