a. ICD-O-3 WG report - Lois ICD-O-3.2 was released on October 1, including the guidelines and all the tables. The Fifth Edition Blue Books review has begun. b. MedMorph report – Wendy B. MedMorph stands for Making EHR Data More Available for Research and Public Health. This project is funded for 3 years by the Patient Centered Outcomes Research Trust fund. Looking for a better way to get data from various EHR systems without posing additional burden on healthcare providers. The three major public health use cases identified and are participating: cancer registry reporting, hepatitis C virus reporting, and healthcare surveys. Several cancer registries were involved in the work group. <p>e. Cancer Informatics Advisory Group update – Eric/Gary Eric reported COVID-19 continues to be a topic of discussion and the group’s recommendations were sent to the board. The Cancer COVID-19 Consortium has reached 5,000 cancer patients with COVID-19. NCI has been invited to discuss at the next meeting the Volume II Data Standards being updated in the Cancer Data Standards Registry and Repositories (CaDSR). Timeliness of cancer registry data is now being discussed.
