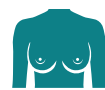
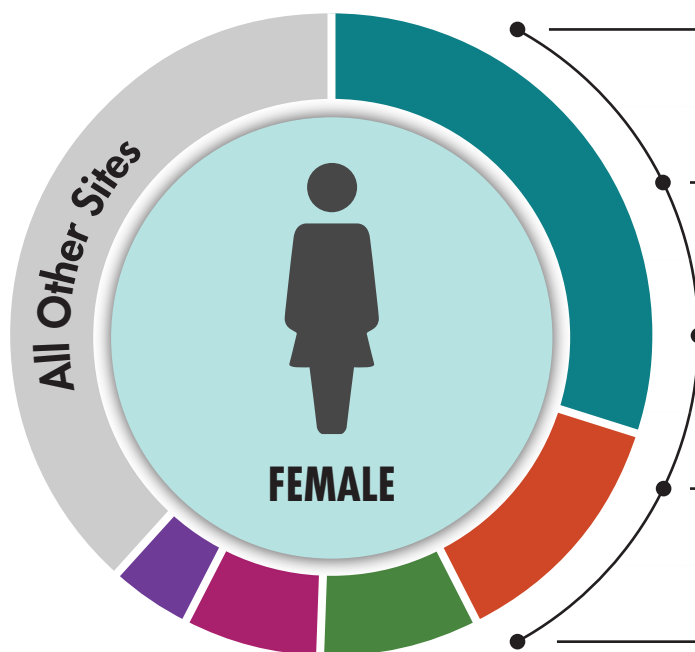


Top Five Most Commonly Diagnosed Cancers in North America by Sex, All Races 2017–2021

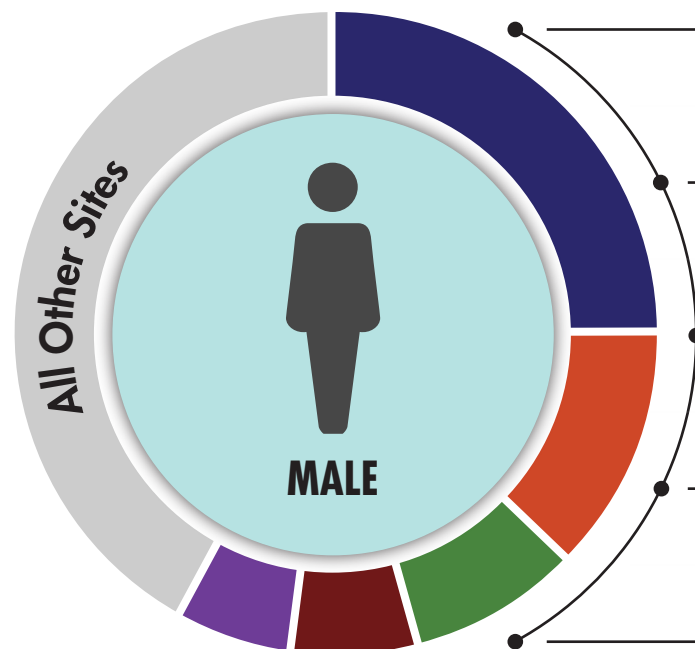
